CAPS Report Beat 1722 & 1723 CAPS Meeting January 20, 2016

Present: Beat facilitator Martha Hack, CAPS Officer Maryjane Parks, CAPS Sgt. Michael Anderson, Property Crimes Detective 3rd Watch Officer, Representatives from offices of Ald. Margaret Laurino (39) and Ald. Carlos Ramirez-Rosa (35)

Due to an increase in the number of burglaries in Beat 1723, a representative from the Burglary Unit spoke. Recent burglaries have occurred between 7:00 a.m. and 5:00 p.m. Burglars gain access by kicking in or prying open a rear or front door. They determine whether anyone is home by ringing the doorbell. They'll move along if someone answers the door. Ways to protect yourself:

- 1. Keep doors and windows locked at all times.
- 2. Be careful not to allow access to a window by position of outdoor furniture.
- 3. If you're away, have neighbors pick up mail or newspapers.

- 4. Record serial numbers of electronics and bikes. These can be matched with pawn shop records.
- 5. Keep photos of jewelry and other valuables.

In addition, the third watch officer shared information about an attempted carjacking that occurred on 12/22/2015. The 4100 blocks of Harding and Springfield were searched by officers and a canine unit around 8:30 p.m. in response to a carjacking. The perpetrators are believed to be part of a carjacking crew who work throughout the city but who had recently been targeting the northwest side. Two of the suspects, who were both juveniles, were arrested the evening of 12/22. Two additional suspects were captured a few nights later. The offenders are not believed to be part of a gang. They target high end luxury vehicles. The Burglary Team and Major Crimes have allocated significant resources to breaking up this crew. It was not known whether the offenders were involved in the abduction that occurred in the 4100 block of Elston in November.

The remainder of the meeting was spent talking about a fatal shooting in the 3200 block of W. Irving Park. The victim was not affiliated with a gang and was running from someone. No further information was available.

The police often look at the number of calls for service in determining the allocation of officers and resources with respect to a particular situation or incident. Meetings begin at 7:30 p.m. on the third Wednesday of the month and typically last one hour. The next regularly scheduled meeting for Beat 1723 is Wednesday, February 17, 2016. MAP Program Holds 3rd Annual Talent Show

News From Irving Park Community Food Pantry

Holiday Program Aids 1,143 Neighbors

The Irving Park Community Food Pantry's December 16th Holiday Distribution provided the makings for a holiday meal to 1,143 of our neighbors in 324 households, about the same number as last year. In addition, 288 children up to 12 years of age in 140 households received a toy, a stocking stuffer and mittens, scarves and caps, a slight increase from last year. We also gave a book to many of the children, although there weren't enough for everyone.

As clients waited for their numbers to be called upstairs in the sanctuary, they enjoyed Christmas caroling led by Dale Tippet and Irving Park United Methodist Church Pastor Katherine Paisley. Arts activities for the children were offered by Arts Van Go Go. Each household also received a United Airlines amenities kits filled with slippers and personal-care items through the support of the Rotary Club Chicago O'Hare.

Some toys remained, but they didn't go to waste. Fifty were donated to Carlson Community Services' Magic After School Place, 25 to the IPUMC Hispanic mission and 10 to St. Viator for their annual holiday adopt-a-family program. The remaining toys were taken by Alderman John Arena to donate to Toys For Tots. We would like to thank everyone for their contributions, as they helped many children at the Pantry and throughout the area.

Thank you to all who hosted food and toy collections in support of our holiday program. Toy boxes were located at Irving Park Baptist Church, Irving Park Lutheran Church, Irving Park United Methodist Church, Josi's Frozen Yogurt Café, Pert Cleaners, St. John's Episcopal Church, Starbucks on Kostner and the office of Alderman John Arena.

Thanks also to Sara Yoest and Debby Fries for coordinating the toy program, to Christine Lee and others for making gift runs and purchasing stocking stuffers. Thanks also to Debby, Anne Mette and everyone else who helped them organize and distribute the toys during the event.

Thanks to the volunteers from Community Animal Rescue Effort (CARE), who obtained donations for our clients' pets and ensured that each pet received a special holiday toy and treat in addition to pet food and supplies during the Holiday Distribution. They gave out supplies to 113 households for dogs, cats, a gerbil, a guinea pig, six parrots and a number of parakeets. We are always in need of cat food especially as well as kibble for small-breed dogs.

We recently received another check for \$2,000 from later donations received after the earlier contribution. All told, the donations have more than doubled last year's contribution!
