IF YOU'RE READING THIS it means you are reading an electronic version of the Wire for the first time. Irving Park Lutheran Church Suspending Worship and Programming During Coronavirus Pandemic With heavy hearts and much concern for individuals that count on our spaces for physical, mental, and spiritual well-being, but with even greater concern for the health and long term good of all and in keeping with the recommendations of the CDC, the IPLC Church Council has suspended all worship, church programs, and activities in all church buildings until further notice, to combat the spread of the coronavirus. We continue on a faith community, but at a distance, inspired by the words of Rabbi Yosef Kanefsky of B'nai David-Judea Congregation in Los Angeles:

"Every hand that we don't shake must become a phone call that we placeEvery embrace that we avoid must become a verbal expression of warmth and concern. Every inch and every foot that we physically place between ourselves and another, must become a thought as to how we might be of help to that other, should the need arise."


March meeting cancelled due to Coronavirus social distancing guidelines

From the CAPS Office: Effective immediately, all scheduled CPD Beat Meetings, & organized community engagements (inclusive of DAC meetings, DV meetings, Youth meetings, senior meetings etc.) are hereby postponed. Please contact our office for any questions: 312-742-4588.

Call 911 to report suspicious activity or individuals in your neighborhood and provide detailed descriptions of the individuals and vehicles involved in any incident. Even if a neighbor has already reported the incident or activity, other neighbors should make separate calls. The police often look at the number of calls for service in determining the allocation of officers and resources with respect to a particular situation or incident. Remember to always lock your vehicle and be on the lookout for scams involving Covid-19 cures and scams related to income tax refunds. Remember, the IRS will never call you on the phone. If you or a neighbor have been the victim of a crime and you would like to share that information with your neighbors, e-mail the details to westwalkercrimealerts@gmail.com. The exact address of the crime and name of the victim will be kept anonymous.

to operate during its regular hours (9 to noon on Wednesdays, 6 to 7:30 pm on the second Tuesday of the month). These procedures will remain in place for the foreseeable future.

Due to concerns about the COVID-19 virus, the Irving Park Community Food Pantry has enacted procedural changes to ensure it can continue

The Pantry's Client Choice model, instituted in September in our new location, has been

suspended so we can return to our original system of providing bags of food based on family size. Clients log in at the Intake desk just inside the front door and then walk around the corner to our parking lot, where they wait for their number to be called.

Our numbers grew throughout March as more neighbors found themselves facing food insecurity with the loss of jobs and lack of resources. We encourage our supporters to make any donation possible. Secure donations can be made through PayPal at our website (www. irvingparkfoodpantry.org) or sent via check to the Pantry at 4256 N. Ridgeway Ave., Chicago IL 60618.

If you have any questions about qualifications to receive food or other services, please email info@ irvingparkfoodpantry.org. To volunteer, email volunteer@ irvingparkfoodpantry.org. We do not want more volunteers than necessary, but our need to fill stations changes weekly.

Thank you to everyone who donated time, money and materials to ensure our Easter basket program was completed. It was started before the virus concerns required changes, but with the support of donations and volunteers, we were able to keep it running until Easter.

Special thanks to the Megan Stalder and the Junior Girl Scout Troop at Disney II Elementary School as well as Pastor Erin Bouman, Larry & Holly Lundquist and the congregation of


