Voting happens in many ways and for different reasons. Over the past year, many of our neighbors here in West Walker have been "voting with their feet" - by staying home and not attending the West Walker Civic Association general meetings. Over the last year, the average attendance at WWCA meetings has been 3 people; one meeting failed to draw a single person. That level of participation is simply unsustainable, and makes the meetings a poor use of the limited volunteer capital we have available.

I have talked to many neighbors, and there are many reasons people do not attend the WWCA meetings. Time is a precious resource, and the demands of family, work and home all demand their share. With so many choices and demands, WWCA meetings don't often rise to the top. At the same time, people are very happy with the events sponsored by the WWCA, the West Walker Wire, WWCA's work with CAPS and the Aldermens' offices and simply acting as a voice for the neighborhood.

This is a process that has developed over several years. The WWCA officers and board are evaluating the best way to provide for the needs of West Walker and keep a strong neighborhood association for years to come. As we examine these issues, more information will be available about changes in the Wire. The WWCA officers are happy to hear any ideas or thoughts on how the WWCA can best adapt and support West Walker. Please call or email us with your thoughts and ideas.

Our next regularly scheduled meeting would be in December. That meeting is cancelled. The next regular meeting after that is in March, 2013. That will likely proceed, but stay tuned.

## 39th Ward Report



AUTUMN IS HERE and that means leaves are falling. If leaves fall on the parkway in front of your home or on your property, you are responsible for their removal (burning is not permitted). Please rake and bag the leaves. Do not rake the leaves into the street, it results in clogged water drains and street sweeper trucks.

When drain gates are blocked rain water, melting ice and snow cannot be drained from the street.

Flu season is just around the corner, so protect yourself against the flu bug. On Wednesday, November 14, I am hosting a Flu Shot Day at my office. The free flu shots will be available from 9:00 a.m. until 2:00 p.m.

On Saturday, December 1, 2012, Chicago reactivates its Winter Overnight Parking Ban for the most critical arterial streets. Signs for this seasonal restriction are permanently posted. Cars parked on arterial streets with a posted seasonal overnight restriction will be ticketed and towed between the hours of 3:00 a.m. and 7:00 a.m., whether or not there is snow on the ground. This restriction is in effect until April 1.

In City Council news, Mayor Emanuel released his 2013 city budget, a budget that does not include any rate hikes or fee increases. For the past several weeks, I have been attending City Council budget hearings. At these hearings, my goal is to make sure that I bring as many resources as possible to the 39th Ward. I anticipate the Mayor's budget will pass the entire City Council in mid-November.



### News from Irving Park Community Food Pantry

#### Senator Durbin Visits Pantry

U. S. Senator Dick Durbin visited the Food Pantry on September 26th to learn about our operation and how we help clients apply online for SNAP (food stamps) benefits. He spoke with several volunteers about our operation as well as clients. His visit was organized by the Greater Chicago Food Depository.

The Senator held a press conference outside the Pantry to discuss the pending Farm Bill, which passed the Senate but was held up in the House. A House proposal would terminate SNAP eligibility to several million people nationwide through restrictions. The primary restriction would allow states to change categorical eligibility, which could restrict SNAP benefits if households own a home or car. It also could increase paperwork requirements and reduce benefits for those who retain eligibility. The Farm Bill is expected to be a priority when Congress reconvenes after the November 6th Election.

IPCFP is the **"One Dime at a Time"** recipient at Whole Foods Market at Sauganash (6020 N. Cicero). The program gives customers a 10¢ credit on their grocery bill for each reusable grocery bag they use. Through December, customers have the option of donating that credit to the Pantry. Last quarter's recipient received \$1,700! So shop Whole Foods, and use reusable bags!

**Mount Olive Church** (3850 N. Tripp Ave.) is looking for volunteers to help with its annual food drive, which benefits our Pantry. Volunteers are needed to distribute flyers to area homes on Sunday, November 11th and to pick up food bags on Sunday, November18th. Lunch will be provided on the 18th for those collecting the food, which is picked up in our delivery truck and brought to the Pantry right away.

**Disney II Elementary School** is holding a food drive for the Pantry in November! Please contribute to their efforts!




