





2014 HOME SALES END STRONG!

2014 was a good year for real estate in Chicago. Although the number of home sales was down versus last year, the median sale price in Chicago was up 8.9% compared to 6% for Illinois. That's a healthy gain.

Here are a few fun facts about homebuyers.

- 27% were cash buyers; down from 30% last year. 61% of those buyers were international buyers.
- 29% were first time buyers.
- 15% were investors, down from 19% last year. Home prices are up so investors are getting priced out.
- 13% of buyers relocated to their new home.
- 9% of sales were distressed sales either a short sale or foreclosure. Foreclosures typically sell for 15% less than a traditional sale and short sales sell for 10% less. Two years ago distressed were 25% of all sales. Just another sign the market is getting stronger.

"Illinois is seeing sales lift as we close out the year, a sign that despite the onset of winter, buyers are still very much interested in making a big ticket purchase," said IAR President Jim Kinney.



Three Brothers Garden Awarded CHIditarod Grant

Three Brothers Garden was recently awarded a \$2,500 grant to partner with the Irving Park Community Food Pantry to encourage food pantry clients to grow vegetables at home. Funds were awarded by the CHIditarod Foundation for Project Homegrown, which is designed to give food pantry clients the tools they need to grow their own fresh, nutritious vegetables. Clients of the Irving Park Food Pantry will participate in hands-on workshops led by Carlson Community Services staff and volunteers to learn container vegetable gardening. The workshops will cover planting, growing and preserving cherry tomatoes and basil. Classes will be taught by Three Brothers Garden committee member Dorene Jordan, who is a Master Gardener and registered nurse. MAP Mentors log 430 hours!

The Magic After-School Place (MAP) is brimming with activity and energy this fall. Forty-one children from Murphy and Belding schools are enrolled in MAP, an after-school program which meets the needs of neighborhood working parents in need of affordable after-school care.

A critical component of the MAP program is our mentoring partnership with Northside College Prep and Schurz High School's BuildOn program. Approximately 38 students from the two high schools are involved in MAP's mentoring program. So far this school year, they've logged a total of 430 hours! MAP mentors assist with homework, one-on-one tutoring and lead clubs. In addition to earning service hours, the mentors gain leadership skills, confidence and a sense of providing a needed service.

Pantry Celebrates Holidays December 17th

this event, we close
the Pantry to our
typical Wednesday
operation and

provide our qualified clients with the makings of a holiday dinner. We also allow those with children to "shop" our Toy Room for a gift for each of them.

We are especially in need of stuffing, cranberry sauce, canned yams and vegetables, instant potatoes, cake mixes, Jell-O and canned pumpkin. For traditional food drives, we also are in need of dry goods, such as peanut butter, macaroni & cheese, hamburger helper-type meals (such as rice-a-roni and pasta-roni), whole-grain crackers, dried fruit and nuts, dry soup mixes, energy bars and juice (100% fruit juice). We always are in need of toiletries and white crew socks.

Children up to 12 years old are eligible to receive a gift, and we typically give out 400 or so to clients. For some, it will be the only gift they receive. Your donations ensure clients' children can talk about their special presents with their friends who receive so much more. We need gifts for older children (age 10 to 12), especially boys, as we receive fewer for that age group. Soccer balls, basketballs, footballs, building sets and board games are good options, as well as age-appropriate nonfiction books and graphic novels (aka comic books). We're also collecting stocking stuffers for all ages. Hats, gloves, scarves, blankets and other personal items also are encouraged.

Drop off **Unwrapped**, **new toys** and food donations at the Pantry at Irving Park United Methodist Church (3801 N. Keeler) during office hours (call 773-283-6262 to check on times, as they vary). Donations can be left at the base of the stairs inside the Grace Street entrance. They also can be brought to the church from 9 a.m. to 12:30 p.m. on Wednesdays during Pantry hours. Additional toy drop-off points are Irving Park Lutheran Church (3938 West Belle Plaine), Josi's Frozen Yogurt Café

(4032 N. Milwaukee), Pert Cleaners (4213 W. Irving Park Road) and St. John's Episcopal Church (3857 N. Kostner). Look for our colorful boxes. **Deadline for toys is Wednesday, December 10th!**

Angel Team Gift-Wrap for the Homeless




